The Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Our Father

I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to amend my life, to do penance and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

Morning Offering

O my God! I offer Thee all my actions of this day for the intentions and for the glory of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I desire to sanctify every beat of my heart, my every thought, my simplest works, by uniting them to Its infinite merits; and I wish to make reparation for my sins by casting them into the furnace of Its Merciful Love. Amen.

Prayer for the Deceased

Eternal rest grant unto them , O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them . May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Holy Spirit Prayer of Saint Augustine

Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit, That my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, That my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, That I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, To defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, That I always may be holy.

The Precepts of the Church

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor." The faithful are required to attend the celebration of the Eucharist every Lord's Day (Saturday vigil or Sunday Mass) and the holy days of obligation as established in the liturgical calendar, unless excused for a serious reason [i.e. illness or the care of infants].
- 2. "You shall confess your sins at least once a year."
- 3. "You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season."
- 4. "You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church."
- 5. "You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church, each according to his own ability."
- 6. To obey the laws of the Church concerning Matrimony.
- 7. To participate in the Church's mission of Evangelization of Souls.(Missionary Spirit of the Church)

The Corporal Works of Mercy

- 1. To feed the hungry;
- 2. To give drink to the thirsty;
- 3. To clothe the naked;
- 4. To harbour the harbourless;
- 5. To visit the sick;
- 6. To ransom the captive;
- 7. To bury the dead.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy

- 1. To instruct the ignorant;
- 2. To counsel the doubtful;
- 3. To admonish sinners;
- 4. To bear wrongs patiently;
- 5. To forgive offences willingly;
- 6. To comfort the afflicted;
- 7. To pray for the living and the dead.
